Nearly a third gave colleges fair to poor marks for producing successful employees. And they dinged bachelor’s-degree holders for lacking basic workplace proficiencies, like adaptability, communication skills, and the ability to solve complex problems.”

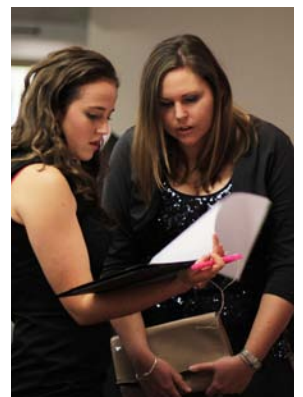

PREPARING FOR YOUR FUTURE CAREER

As a college student or recent graduate, it is important to find ways to add value as a future employee. Participating in an international internship experience is one way you can take a big step in differentiating yourself from other college graduates. Sure, you can participate in a domestic internship, but so will everyone else. Fewer students venture abroad for Global Career- Building Experiences. Interning abroad will not only allow you to explore potential career paths, but it will also give you the opportunity to gain valuable skills in unique ways.

HARD VERSUS SOFT SKILLS

When you hear the term skills, you may tend to naturally think of hard skills. These are typically tangible and technical skills, like knowing certain software, mathematics, or typing. These are often the easiest to recognize and talk about. Soft skills are personal characteristics that enhance the way a person conducts their job and handles working relationships. Soft skills also fall into a very important category of transferable skills. Transferable skills are skills that are commonly utilized across many fields and positions. Employers value these types of skills, because they are harder to teach than hard skills.



5 KEY SKILLS ASSOCIATED WITH INTERNING ABROAD

The good news is that many of the skills associated with interning abroad tend to be soft and transferable. The five skills listed below are often mentioned as the most desirable by employers and are examples of skills you can hone while abroad:

- **Communication** – the verbal or written sharing of information to others
- **Problem Solving** – the thought process of coming up with solutions to issues
- **Adaptability** – the ability to adapt to new and changing environments or situations
- **Planning/Organizational Skills**– being able to complete or plan a project or task in an efficient and planned manner
- **Initiative** –ability to take charge or action without prompting

WHAT ARE SOME WAYS THAT YOU MIGHT USE THESE SKILLS WHILE ABROAD?

While spending time abroad, you will undoubtedly be put into many unfamiliar and challenging situations that will utilize the 5 skills to the left. How you react to these situations is what leads to learning. Below are some example scenarios that you might encounter while abroad that can be learning opportunities:

- You face language barriers in your housing facility.
- You find that your internship site supervisor is not giving you the duties and projects that you were expecting.
- The work environment at your marketing internship placement is much different than the work structure from your home country.
- You are having trouble connecting with your homestay family.
- You plan a weekend trip for you and a group of five friends.

My internship proved I was capable of becoming my own person in the real world. 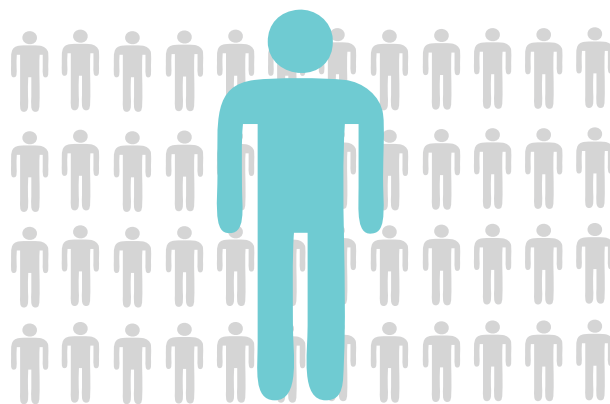

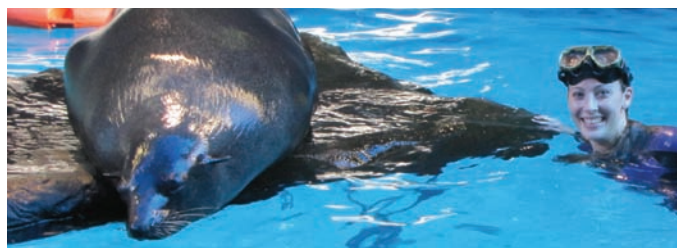

PROGRAM OPTIONS

GlobalLinks Learning Abroad Internships are available in every field of study (see pages 22 – 39 for sample placements).

All of our internship programs include the same high-quality placements and inclusions; however, there are different program models in order to suit all applicants. The following options are available in all locations world-wide, and all internships are unpaid.

10-WEEK INTERNSHIPS

- Four pre-set intakes each year (see dates pg. 11)
- Includes our multi-day on-site Bridging Cultures Orientation Program (pg. 14)
- Option to add on 6 U.S. credits through Chapman University (see right)

6-WEEK INTERNSHIPS

- Four pre-set intakes each year (see dates pg. 11)
- Includes our multi-day on-site Bridging Cultures Orientation Program (p. 14)
- Option to add on 4 U.S. credits through Chapman University (see right)
- Not available in Hong Kong

CUSTOM DATE INTERNSHIPS

Custom Date Internship placements are available for interns who are unable to participate in one of our pre-set 6 or 10-week placements for any one of the following reasons:

- You cannot attend the program during the pre-set dates.
- You need an internship duration other than 6 or 10 weeks.

ACADEMIC CREDIT OPTION

You have the option to add an academic credit component to the 10-week and 6-week internship programs. If you select this option, you will have standard written assignments to complete, in addition to the hours that you will work at the internship site.

Custom Date Internship placements do not carry credit from Chapman University; however, you can often arrange credit with your home university.

In order to qualify for the Academic Credit Option, you must meet the following criteria:

- All applicants must either be full-time students who have completed at least 45 credit hours, or have recently graduated from a bachelor degree program at a U.S. or Canadian university.
- A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required to participate; however, some placements may have more stringent eligibility requirements.

SCHOOL OF RECORD: CHAPMAN UNIVERSITY

Academic credit is issued by our School of Record, Chapman University, which has a long history of commitment to international education.

Chapman University is an established university located in Orange, California, with a strong mission in developing global citizens. Chapman University is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities. ADDITIONAL COST CONSIDERATIONS

In addition to the program fees, students are responsible for international flights, in-country transportation to/from the internship sites (Australia, New Zealand, Spain, London, Chile), meals, immigration visa fees, and all personal costs for the period of the program, as well as any extra travel.

FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID/UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

You may be able to use your financial aid or scholarships that are granted through your home university. The U.S. Department of Education advises that the Perkins Loans, SSIG Grant Program, Pell Grants, FSEOG Grants, Stafford Loans, SLS Loans, PLUS Loans, and Consolidation Loans can be used. In order to utilize financial aid, you will need to be enrolled for credit either through your home university or through our academic credit option.

PROGRAM DISCOUNTS & SCHOLARSHIPS FOR AFFILIATED STUDENTS

Many U.S. and Canadian universities have chosen to affiliate with GlobalLinks Learning Abroad. All students from these universities receive special benefits, including a free application fee waiver and \$100 off program fees.

PAYMENT PLANS

Standard and customized payment plans are available to help you pay for your program.

CROWDFUNDING

We have created a crowdfunding program, which allows every penny you collect to go towards your program costs.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are a number of opportunities for scholarships to help you finance your international internship. In addition to your university's study abroad office and various websites that offer scholarships, we have also partnered up with two organizations to provide you with scholarships. Please note that for most scholarship opportunities, you must be receiving academic credit for your internship.

THE FOUNDATION FOR GLOBAL SCHOLARS

The Foundation for Global Scholars is a 501c(3) non-profit organization which GlobalLinks Learning Abroad has partnered with to offer internship-specific scholarships. Awards are in \$1,000 USD increments and students are not required to be receiving academic credit for their internship, but must be enrolled in a North American institution.



FREEMAN-ASIA SCHOLARSHIPS

Freeman-ASIA (Freeman Awards for Study in Asia) is designed to support American undergraduates with demonstrated financial need who are planning to study in East or Southeast Asia. The student must be receiving credit for their internship experience, and the internship must be at least 8 weeks for the summer, 10 weeks for a quarter term, and 12 weeks for a semester term.

ELIGIBILITY

Our internships are available to current students as well as recent graduates. There are specific eligibility requirements for some destinations due to immigration visa restrictions:

Australia and New Zealand:

- Between the ages of 18-30 at the time of application (immigration visa requirement)
- Citizens of the U.S., Canada, U.K., Ireland, France, Germany, Netherlands, Hong Kong, and Japan are all eligible for the program. We may be able to assist students from other countries, so please inquire with our office if your citizenship is not listed.

Shanghai, China and Hong Kong:

- Citizens of the U.S., Canada, Europe, U.K., China, Hong Kong, and some additional countries are eligible. We may be able to assist students from other countries, so please inquire with our office if your citizenship is not listed.
- Must be 18 or older at the time of application

Valencia, Spain & Singapore:

- Citizens of the U.S., Canada, Europe, and the U.K. are eligible.
- Must be 18 or older at the time of application

London, England:

- If not an EU citizen, you must be enrolled as a full-time degree-level student or a graduate intending to begin your internship no more than 12 months beyond the end of study
- Must be 18 or older at the time of application

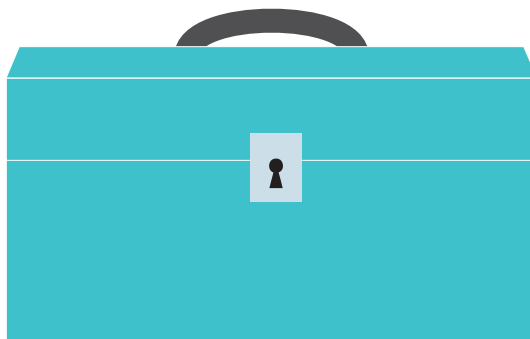
IMMERSION IN YOUR WORKPLACE & COMMUNITY

BRIDGING CULTURES ORIENTATION PROGRAM

Multi-Day In-Country Orientation Program

The GlobalLinks Learning Abroad Bridging Cultures Orientation Program is our signature orientation program for all 6 and 10 week internship participants (not available to Custom Date Internship participants). The cost for this multi-day program is included in your program fees and covers several nights accommodation, most meals, local transportation, and excursions.

Typically 3 – 4 days in length, each orientation program includes:

- Exciting excursions and activities
- A chance to meet other students
- Orientation sessions to help you adapt to your new country

Orientation sites vary based on the location of your program. Each site is selected based on the proximity to your internship site, as well as for the unique activities available within the area.

Sample activities*

- Pet a kangaroo and hold a koala in Australia
- Māori cultural experience and feast in New Zealand
- Dive into the old town of Shanghai, including the bazaar and the Yuyan Gardens

- Take a day trip to Valparaíso and visit Pablo Neruda's house in Santiago, Chile
- Tour Buckingham Palace and see a show in the West End in London, England
- Dinner at Hawker Market and visit to the Botanical Gardens in Singapore

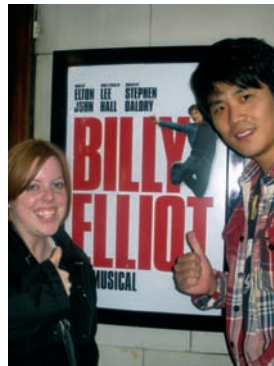

DISCOVERY ACTIVITIES

Our in-country resident staff suggests recommended self-led activities for students throughout the time abroad. Activities are optional and designed to explore the five key areas of discovery: academic, social, personal, cultural, and professional. These are not just visits to tourist attractions. For instance, these activities include things like networking opportunities, local festivals, gallery openings, and other similar events that you can't find in a travel book but that will truly enhance your experience.



SAMPLE SELF-LED DISCOVERY ACTIVITIES

- **The Great Sydney Race Scavenger Hunt – Sydney, Australia**

In order to explore local landmarks and to mingle with locals, interns are challenged to a scavenger hunt which takes them all over the city.

- **Career Exposition – Wellington, New Zealand**

Interns in Wellington attend the main graduate recruitment fair for a local university and network with local businesses to see the possibilities that await them when they graduate.

- **Professional Networking – Hong Kong and Shanghai, China**

Interns attend a professional networking event or a dinner with a guest speaker, such as an industry leader, successful entrepreneur, or business manager. Interns are able to get an inside perspective about business in China and Hong Kong, as well as Asia as a whole.

Ask Questions About Your School's Policies for Completing an Internship

Your internship or academic advisor is the best person to speak with about the academic credit option, using your financial aid and scholarships to pay for the program, any special forms you need to supply your school, or any specific processes you need to complete. You should also contact your study abroad office.

THE APPLICATION AND PLACEMENT

Apply

You will need to complete our application and submit the supporting materials, including a cover letter, resume, two letters of recommendation, and an application fee. The application fee is \$30 for online applications and \$50 for paper applications. Please see the next page for tips for a standout application.

Commit to the Program

Once your application is complete and has been assessed by GlobalLinks Learning Abroad, one of our Program Managers will give you a call to discuss your goals for this program so that we can custom build an internship experience that meets your needs. You will then be asked to pay an initial deposit of \$400 (which is applied to your total program fees) before your application is sent to one of our overseas offices for placement. This shows that you are serious and committed to the program. Your initial payment will be returned if we are unable to place you into an internship, though this is very rare. A fee will be assessed if you cancel before or after we have found an internship for you.

AFTER ACCEPTANCE

Accept your Placement

Once a specific internship site has agreed to host you, you will receive a formal internship offer with the details of your placement. You will need to sign and submit this offer with the next payment of \$1,500 (which is applied to your program fees) to confirm your placement. If you cancel your program prior to accepting your formal offer, you will not receive a refund of your initial \$400 payment. If you cancel after accepting an offer, additional cancellation penalties will apply.

Follow Your To-Do List

Upon acceptance, you will have a To Do List and Participant Guide easily accessible through your online account. You will simply click on the link and follow the instructions to complete the item.

DEPARTURE AND PARTICIPATION

Once you arrive abroad, you will take part in the multi-day Bridging Cultures Orientation Program with other interns who will also be in the country during the same period (see page 14). This is a great chance to meet other interns, as well as learn valuable information through orientation sessions. You will create a network of friends to keep in touch with throughout your time abroad. (Interns on Custom Date Internships do not participate in a Bridging Cultures Program, but will have a similar orientation via Skype or a less formal orientation in-country.)

TIPS FOR A STANDOUT APPLICATION

The actual internship is not the only learning process of the internship program. The initial step of preparing the application also gives you exposure and experience in preparing professional-looking documents for future career opportunities.

HELPFUL HINTS

Spelling and Grammar - The internship sites take notice of spelling and grammatical errors. It is very important that you take the time to proof your documents.

Thoughtfulness - In answering the personal statement questions, it is recommended that you take the time to think about your answers. Ask yourself if your cover letter sufficiently explains your goals. Keep in mind that the internship site supervisor will read these documents and consider them in their decision.

Relevant Education/Experience - Do you have the educational background in the field in which you want to intern? In most cases, the internship sites look to host interns who are obtaining a degree in a field related to the placement.

Honesty - It is always best to be honest about your level of skills. The internship sites accept students based on the information in cover letters and resumes. Providing false information could result in serious ramifications, including termination of your placement and cancellation of your internship visa. Also, it is best to indicate any special needs or disabilities so that the appropriate arrangements can be made with the internship site.

RESUME

Your resume is also a key element in the application process. It is important that you show your possible internship host what relevant education, interests, and experience you have to support your desire to intern in the field that you have chosen. Be sure to indicate your major and minor study areas.

COVER LETTER

Your cover letter is probably the most important document that you will provide with your internship application. Your cover letter should not be geared toward a specific internship site or location, but rather should be general and focused on the specific field in which you are interested and on the various types of learning outcomes you would like to achieve. Also, let the reader know why you want to intern abroad. We suggest that you keep your location options open to all destinations. Each of these amazing destinations offer high quality internship placements, fascinating cultural experiences, and the chance to learn relevant and transferable skills and knowledge. You can use a general salutation such as "To Whom it May Concern." If you are having trouble narrowing down the industry or duties that interest you, we encourage you to seek the advice of your academic advisor or internship coordinator at your home university.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Your two letters of recommendation should be from professors, academic advisors, previous/current employers, or a combination of the three. The most professional presentation is to have the letters typed on university or company letterhead.

PERSONAL INFORMATION ON THE WEB

Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, and other social media websites have become very popular communication tools for many individuals. These sites have also become very useful employer screening tools to help determine if potential job candidates are suitable for their organization. Therefore, it is highly recommended that careful consideration be given to privacy levels and posted content, as it may affect your chances of being accepted in to an internship. It is important to remember that any content posted on the web can potentially be duplicated and become hard to remove. Applicants should also consider the level of professionalism and maturity that personal voicemail messages and email addresses convey.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Internship programs are open and accessible to all students of varying backgrounds and needs. We seek to work with each intern, their home university, and the internship site to ensure the needs of the intern can and will be met during this international experience.

Placements may be full prior to the application deadline, because applications are accepted and reviewed on an individual basis through rolling admissions. If your desired placement is no longer available, we will try to provide you with other options. Please apply early for the best chance of obtaining your placement choice. There are no guarantees that you will be placed in an internship, but our success rate is very high.

APPLICATION FORM

You can apply at globalinksabroad.org/apply. Alternately, complete the application form (front and back) including all required signatures. Your program choice can be changed in the initial stages of the process without additional fees.

MYLEARN ACCOUNT

Once your application has been received, you will be able to view program details, status updates, program specific announcements, application and enrollment checklists, and much more through your personalized MyLearn account. If you have not already created a MyLearn account, one will be created upon receipt of your application and you will be given a login and password at that time.

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT

Order one official transcript from your home university. If you are planning to receive the add-on credit, you must have a minimum of 45 semester credits. This transcript can be included with your application or your university can mail it directly to our office. We can also accept official electronic copies direct from the registrar's office. If you have attended more than one university or college, you will need to submit official transcripts from each institution.

LETTERS OF REFERENCE

You will need to submit two letters of recommendation with your application. These letters can come from professors, advisors, current/previous employers, or any combination of the three. Letters should be submitted on official university or company letterhead and addressed "To Whom it May Concern."

COVER LETTER AND RESUME

Please submit a current one-page resume and a cover letter along with your application. You should focus your cover letter on describing the type of internship you are seeking and your goals for that internship. Please refrain from referencing a specific internship placement in your cover letter.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This information will be used by the Internship Placement Coordinator in-country who will be locating your internship. Please provide complete responses to each question on a separate document. Please verify that all sentences are complete; spelling, grammar, and punctuation are correct; and questions are answered completely.

PHOTOGRAPH

You will be asked to upload a photograph into your MyLearn account after we have received and entered your application. This photography will be used for identification purposes. You may also be required to submit hard-copy official passport-sized photographs. You will be notified if they are required.

APPLICATION FEE

The application fee is \$30 USD for online applications and \$50 USD for hardcopy applications. Payment can be made by credit card or check.

PROGRAM PAYMENTS*

There will be two different program payments before you are confirmed into your internship placement. Once your application is reviewed, you will pay a \$400 deposit before we send your application overseas. After your internship has been arranged, you will then secure your place in the program with a \$1,500 payment. The remainder of the program fees will be due 30 days prior to departure.

Combine your semester abroad program with an internship experience in Australia, New Zealand, and Wales. Internships are available for credit in a range of subjects.

Study Internship Combination Programs allow you to take a part-time load of classes (one to three, depending on the university) at select universities in Australia, New Zealand, and Wales while undertaking a professional internship in your field at a local organization. For many students this is an ideal arrangement, offering immersion into both collegiate and work environments. You will receive credit from the host university, for both the classes and the internship, on an official university transcript and be considered a full-time student. Placements are limited and not guaranteed, and in most cases, internships cannot be finalized before you arrive at the university overseas.

If you are considering the Study Internship Combination Program, a flexible attitude is key. GlobalLinks Learning Abroad accepts you into the study program, but the university must accept you separately into the internship component. The universities themselves arrange the internships and place you with a host company; however, some companies will only take on a student following an in-person interview. There is also a chance that an internship will not be available to you, so please be prepared that you may instead be only able to do the study component and take a full load of classes.

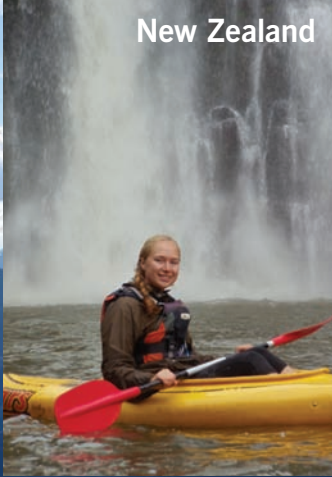
