





Multi-Day In-Country Orientation Program

The GlobaLinks Learning Abroad Bridging Cultures Orientation Program is our signature orientation program for all semester and year abroad students. The cost for this multi-day program is included in your program fees and covers several nights' accommodation, most meals, local transportation, and excursions.

Typically 4-6 days in length, each orientation program includes:

- Exciting excursions and activities
- A chance to meet other students
- Orientation sessions to help you adapt to your new country

Orientation sites vary based on the location of your program. Each site is selected based on the proximity to your host university, as well as for the unique activities available within the area.

- Live alongside locals and volunteer for two days in a rural village in Fiji

Some examples of previous excursions include: Barcelona, Madrid, Toledo, Córdoba, Granada, Portugal, El Escorial, and Valencia.



In addition to the Bridging Cultures Orientation Program, many of our partner universities provide excursions which are included in the program fee. These may be field trips associated with your classes or multi-day excursions with other international students from around the world.

Study Internship Combination Programs allow you to take a part-time load of classes (one to three, depending on the university) at select universities in Australia, New Zealand, and Wales while undertaking a professional internship in your field at a local organization. For many students this is an ideal arrangement, offering immersion into both collegiate and work environments. You will receive credit from the host university, for both the classes and the internship, on an official university transcript and be considered a full-time student. Placements are limited and not guaranteed, and in most cases, internships cannot be finalized before you arrive at the university overseas.

If you are considering the Study Internship Combination Program, a flexible attitude is key. GlobaLinks Learning Abroad accepts you into the study program, but the university must accept you separately into the internship component. The universities themselves arrange the internships and place you with a host company; however, some companies will only take on a student following an in-person interview. COMPETITIVE TUITION COSTS

In total, fees for studying in the United Kingdom, New Zealand, or Australia are actually quite similar to studying in the U.S. because of the different lengths of study and costs of daily life. With the availability of shorter programs studying overseas can be surprisingly affordable, particularly for some Masters, PhD, and professional degrees. In New Zealand, international PhD students pay the same tuition rates as domestic citizens, and Australia and the UK offer several MBA programs that are only one year in length. 
EuroScholars is designed for outstanding, independent, mature, and motivated advanced undergraduate students with a strong interest in an academic/research career.


